We rented three Argos from the ISA for two weeks and all had fantastic fun trapeezing. The final week of sailing will be on 18th August with a Junior Regatta on Saturday 23rd with a camp

Access to Rush Sailing Club is now available to members via their mobile phone. If you provided mobile number renewal/application form, your number is registered on a new system for either 0892071261 OR 0892071262. To gain access call the assigned phone number from your mobile phone and the gate will open and close automatically. Please ensure your number is not blocked or the gate will NOT open. Calling from another phone will not gain access. Please only dial the number once you are near the Club. Passing this number to another person will not give them access, as their phone will not be registered on our system. The present "zappers" will continue to be used but may need to be reprogrammed at which stage we will contact members to advise.
